

# #1 Situation Disaster Assessment Report in Asht district, Sughd region Tajikistan

**Assessment date:** 12 June 2011, 12:30 – 16:30

**Assessment methodology:** interviews with local authorities, population and direct observation, photo documentation

## A. Event Overview

As a result of heavy rains, on June 11, 2011 mudflow occurred in the villages Bobodahon and Saro, Jamoat Pongaz, Asht district of Sughd region). Following CoES in Sughd authorities request, REACT- Khujand assessment team visited the disaster site and jointly with the local authorities conducted primary Damage and Needs assessment.

Due to the assessment, Mudflow totally destroyed 86 houses (33 fully destroyed and 53 partly destroyed). 516 inhabitants of the totally destroyed houses are currently hosted by relatives and neighbors.



Mudflow damaged 11 km of local roads and 80 meters irrigation channels in these villages. In addition, 500 meters electricity supply lines have been damaged and currently electricity is available in the villages. Mudflow destroyed crops on 8,8 ha of kitchen gardens (potatoes, fruit trees and e.g.).

### **C. Needs**

Due to the assessment, 516 of affected population / 86 families need urgent assistance in food and basic non food items, like mattresses, blankets and e.g. Also water cans and hygienic kits to be provided.

Worth to highlight that, that the most kitchen gardens of the population Bobodarhon and Saro villages during the assessment were identify as affected families, who barely meet their basic needs and should be given for food assistance to be provided.



It is important to underline, that the mud flaw channel in is full at the moment and cleaning up activities (mitigation work) should be done with involving local population, authorities and technical support (fuel, car oil, diesel - around 10 tons) as soon as possible.

500 meters of irrigation system should be renovated as soon as possible, as people in the village have lack access to the pure water.

### **D. Response provided**

So far, response with 6 machines has been provided to affected population for cleaning up roads and channels.

### **E. Response planned to be provided:**

#### **Red Crescent Society of Tajikistan, Sughd region:**

- For affected 86 families planned provided mattresses, blankets, pillows, bed sheets, hygienic kits, kitchen kits, water cans (20 liters), summer tents, shovels, buckets, Flash-lights, Soap
